The webCAPE Placement Exam is used to ensure that you are appropriately placed in courses where you can succeed and make progress.

Students **are required** to take a language Placement Test if they

- do speak the language of study
- have taken one or more courses in the language of study in grade school or high school, or other college.

Students are **not** required to take the Placement Test if they

- have never spoken the language of study
- have never taken the language in school
- received a C or better in a college level credit language course before CCC or at CCC.

Students may take this free placement exam online or in the Testing Center at any of the seven City Colleges
